### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### **CELEBRATING OUR PATRON**



On 3 December 1552 Fr. Francis Xavier lay dying at the age of 46 on the island of Shangchuan, just a few miles off the coast of China. He was waiting for permission to enter the country and share the message of Jesus Christ with the inhabitants of the great Chinese Empire. He had already given a decade of his life to this work, first in the Portuguese and native settlements in India, then in the islands of Southeast Asia, and finally in Japan, where he was the first priest to ever visit the country.

Sometimes I wonder how he felt at the end of his life. Did he know the depth of his impact – bringing the faith to places that still hold it fervently, even almost five centuries later? Did he know the powerful witness that the Japanese Christians would give, remaining faithful through three centuries of persecution? How great was his dejection that he never made it to the greatest nation in the Far East?

Perhaps the greatest question – would he know how we are still inspired by his example, four and a half centuries after his death? We live in a time not of evangelization but of re-evangelization: of bringing the message of the Gospel to those who know something of Christianity but not much beyond that, or of those who have been baptized but never really instructed in the Faith. May our celebration of his feast during this first week of Advent not only bring us to a fresh appreciation of his witness, but also of how we are called to emulate it in our world of today.

You might also consider some private devotions at home such as praying the Holy Rosary or reading the Bible. Please also make an effort to go to Confession before the celebration of Christmas




ELEMENTARY SCHOOL





On our bulletin cover is a painting by Edvard Munch entitled simply *Morning* (1884 - Wikiart). This could be a contemporary interpretation of Mary Magdalen arising on Easter Morn. It could also be you this Advent season, keeping eager spiritual vigil for the coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ. "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come!"

# The Sacred Liturgy for 1st Sunday of Advent, 29 November

# **Processional Hymn: O Come, O Come, Emmanuel**

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel, And ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here, Until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel! Shall come to thee. O Israel.

## 1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Is 63:16b-17, 19b; 64:2-7

You, LORD, are our father, our redeemer you are named forever. Why do you let us wander, O LORD, from your ways, and harden our hearts so that we fear you not? Return for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your heritage. Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, with the mountains quaking before you, while you wrought awesome deeds we could not hope for, such as they had not heard of from of old. No ear has ever heard, no eye ever seen, any God but you doing such deeds for those who wait for him. Would that you might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways! Behold, you are angry, and we are sinful; all of us have become like unclean people, all our good deeds are like polluted rags; we have all withered like leaves, and our guilt carries us away like the wind. There is none who calls upon your name, who rouses himself to cling to you; for you have hidden your face from us and have delivered us up to our guilt. Yet, O LORD, you are our father; we are the clay and you the potter: we are all the work of your hands.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: 1 Cor 1:3-9

Brothers and sisters: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks to my God always on your account for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus, that in him you were enriched in every way, with all discourse and all knowledge, as the testimony to Christ was confirmed among you, so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will keep you firm to the end, irreproachable on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, and by him you were called to fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.
