#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

# THE GREATEST OF GIFTS FOR OUR DECEASED LOVED ONES

In this month of November, as nature dies around us, our minds are drawn to the consideration of our own mortality. Connected with this is the remembrance of loved ones who have passed from this life and are no longer with us.

As a people of faith we believe that the soul lives on when our body dies. It bears mentioning that this isn't only a Christian belief: many peoples, cultures, and religions around the world believe the same thing, albeit with differences between them. When we die our soul goes before God for judgement on how we have lived – how we have responded to the guidance and grace He has given us in life. If we have responded perfectly, we are welcomed into Heaven; if we have rejected God's friendship on earth, this decision of ours is made permanent in Hell. If we have lived a good life, but not a perfect one, our soul goes through Purgatory, a place of cleansing and purification in preparation for Heaven.

We believe that our prayers here on earth are able to help those going through the cleansing of Purgatory. We pray for the dead at every Mass, but this is an especial practice during the month of November. One particular act of devotion encouraged by the Church is going to the cemetery to pray for our loved ones and others buried there. Typically, during the 8 days after All Souls' Day (2 Nov.), a plenary indulgence – the remission of the temporal punishment due to sin through a special gift of God's grace – can be spiritually given to a soul when we visit a cemetery and pray for the souls of those buried there. This month, in light of the ongoing restrictions due to the pandemic, Pope Francis has extended the grant of this indulgence throughout the month of November. It can likewise be gained for a soul by visiting a church and praying the Our Father and Creed while there.

The indulgence may be granted by performing either of the above actions, along with the following:

- Going to Confession (on that day, or within 2 weeks before or after)
- Receiving Holy Communion (on the day itself)
- Praying for the intentions of the Pope (also on that day)
- Being otherwise not guilty of any personal sin (which would be the case if we've gone to Confession)

This November, may each of us take the time to remember our loved ones who have passed away, all the faithful departed, and especially those with nobody else to pray for them, and seek for them this special grace.

Please note that our Saint Vincent de Paul Society will be holding another "pop up" fundraiser in the parish east parking lot on Saturday 14 November between 9 am and 11 am during which they will be accepting donations of gift cards for their local clients for Thanksgiving.

MASS COUNT: During this weekend our ushers will begin the annual Mass count for the diocese. Each year the diocese requires that we take a census of Mass attendance during 4 weeks in November. Since we are already operating at a lower church capacity (even with the extra Sunday Mass) we do not expect that this year will compare well with past years, however it should give the diocese a sense of Mass attendance at each parish during this present pandemic. 


ELEMENTARY SCHOOL ACUSHNET, MASSACHUSETTS

The Parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins William Blake (1822)





### The Sacred Liturgy for 32<sup>ND</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, 08 November

### **Processional Hymn:** Alleluia! Sing to Jesus

Alleluia! Sing to Jesus! His the scepter, His the throne, Alleluia His the triumph, His the victory alone. Hark! The songs of peaceful Zion, Thunder like a mighty flood, Jesus out of every nation, Hath redeemed us by His Blood.

### **1st Reading: Wis 6:12-16**

Resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her, and found by those who seek her. She hastens to make herself known in anticipation of their desire; whoever watches for her at dawn shall not be disappointed, for he shall find her sitting by his gate. For taking thought of wisdom is the perfection of prudence, and whoever for her sake keeps vigil shall quickly be free from care; because she makes her own rounds, seeking those worthy of her, and graciously appears to them in the ways, and meets them with all solicitude.

**Responsorial Psalm:** My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God

### **2<sup>nd</sup> Reading:** 1 Thes 4:13-18

We do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep. Indeed, we tell you this, on the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will surely not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God, will come down from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Thus we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore, console one another with these words.

### Gospel Reading: Mt 25:1-13

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones, when taking their lamps, brought no oil with them, but the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps. Since the bridegroom was long delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep. At midnight, there was a cry, 'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!' Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise ones replied, 'No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves.' While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. Afterwards the other virgins came and said, 'Lord, Lord, open the door for us!' But he said in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.' Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour."
