CELEBRATING THE *Real Last Day* OF THE CHRISTMAS SEASON

You read that right. While we took down our Christmas decorations and returned to Ordinary Time after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord a couple of weeks ago, the traditional last-Christmas-related-feast is yet to come: the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on 2 February.

The introduction to this Mass calls to our attention that this day is the 40th after Christmas. It recalls how, 40 days after His birth, Jesus was presented in the Temple by His parents according to Jewish custom.

Our culture continues to associate this day with the change of season, with Groundhog Day. On a more religious note, this day remembers the coming of Christ the light into the world. A poem by Englishman Robert Herrick ties the failure to take down any remaining Christmas decorations with a curse:

CEREMONY UPON CANDLEMAS EVE

Down with the rosemary, and so Down with the bays and misletoe; Down with the holly, ivy, all, Wherewith ye dress'd the Christmas Hall: That so the superstitious find No one least branch there left behind: For look, how many leaves there be Neglected, there (maids, trust to me) So many goblins you shall see.

Besides removing your last decorations, Mass this day begins with a procession during which candles are blessed. If you would like to have candles blessed but are unable to come to Mass that day, simply leave your candles – *clearly marked with your name and the Mass time you attend* – *in the box by the vestry door at Mass next weekend. They will be blessed on 2 Feb. and available for you to retrieve the following Sunday. If you can come to the Mass, it will be a wonderful way to mark the true end of the Christmas season. Some of the blessed candles will be used for the blessing of throats the following day, St. Blaise's Day.*


Great News - Worldwide Marriage Encounter has gone "Virtual"!



The Sacred Liturgy For the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, 24 January 2021

Processional Hymn: Alleluia! Sing to Jesus

Alleluia! Sing to Jesus! His the scepter, His the throne. Alleluia! His the triumph, His the victory alone. Hark! The songs of peaceful Zion, thunder like a mighty flood, Jesus out of every nation. Hath redeemed us by His blood.

1st Reading: Jhn. 3:1-5, 10

The word of the Lord came to Jonah, saying: "Set out for the great city of Nineveh, and announce to it the message I will tell you." So Jonah made ready and went to Nineveh, according to the Lord's bidding. Now Nineveh was an enormously large city; it took three days to go through it. Jonah began his journey through the city, and had gone but a single day's walk announcing, "Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed," when the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth. When God saw by their actions how they turned from their evil way, he repented of the evil that he had threatened to do to them: he did not carry it out.

Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him.
